It believes that the Local Governing Board with the Headteacher of the individual school is best placed to decide on the curriculum and delivery of the optional sections, and that the sections relating to the National Curriculum that will be followed in accordance with their cohort. This policy contributes to the spiritual, moral, social, and cultural education in our schools.
